DCC Follow-Up: Amber

- Electronics at school
 - Going okay; no negative response yet, but some positives

- Science Labs

School Report: Mr. Hodson

- iPad cart
 - o Getting used more and more
 - The schedule for the cart is full most of the time
 - Used for RAZ kids, math, etc.
- SAGE (testing)
 - Fluid process, but as of now, but for grades 3-6 they've added a writing component to the spring test.
 - They'll be using a plug-in keyboard with the iPads to take the SAGE tests.

- o David Smith said a bunch of times they have extra money and the squeaky wheels will get it.
- Amber on the new testing: In the past we've done the CRT basic question and answer with multiple choice. The SAGE testing is different. As one example, they're given a passage that's a little tough to read and then given 5 descriptive words that they have to decide which one is best to describe the passage. Then they had to find a sentence to support their answer and then another sentence.
- During the SAGE testing, everyone will have the option to have headphones where the test is read to them.
