Attendance

Grading

Grades can always be checked on Skyward on a weekly basis. Please let us know if you have any questions. Grades will be sent home at the end of each semester in the form of a report card with their final grades sent at the end of the year.

Grades are broken down into these categories (Participation is factored into each category):	
Language Arts	Assignments, Grammar, Handwriting, Reading, Writing, and Spelling
Math	Assignments and Tests
Science	Assignments in the following categories: Earth's Surface, Chemical/Physical Changes,
	Magnets/Electricity, and Heredity/Adaptation
Social Studies	Assignments based on US History

Homework

Students are expected to read for 20 minutes each school night – 5 days a week. They will be given a home reading calendar to track their minutes.

Students will have a spelling assignment to complete each week. These spelling assignments will be given out on Monday and will be due on Friday.

Students will have math homework to review concepts when needed. Math homework will also consist of work not completed in class. Math homework is always due the next day.

- spelling assignments
- math when assigned
- review times tables
